

This course has been written in line with the Ofsted response to the "Everyone's Invited" campaign. The course comprises 7 weekly 2.5 hour sessions. Alongside this course, consultancy and advice is on offer to the organisation hosting or buying into the programme to ensure their policy on sexual harassment challenge, reporting and response is clear and well communicated to all staff and volunteers.

### Course aims and objectives:

- Offer participants a safe space for discussion and examination of issues facing women right now (ie – feeling safe, feeling heard, feeling empowered).
- Promote improved self esteem and confidence through a range of activities.
- Provide accurate unbiased information and resources.
- Enable participants to make positive choices about their own lives.

### Appropriate participants:

Girls and young women participating in girls' groups, youth settings, school based projects.

#### Course Outline:

- Week 1: Welcome and introductions, explanation of course and ground rules. "Something I" sheet and feedback of same.
- Week 2: Agree/Disagree game "Women Should...". Start scrapbooks.
- Week 3: Women in the media collage and discussion, and presentation.
- Week 4: "Whose Body" presentation and discussion. The Everyday Sexism Project, Me Too and Everyone's Invited. Johari's Window – our style.
- Week 5: Multimedia who says what and why – online attack and defence. The rise of the Incel. Myth and Reality game. Jam jars painting.
- Week 6: Managing Risk presentation. High risk/low risk/no risk game – discussion and feedback.
- Week 7: Review of "Something I" sheets. Review of our Window.
  Filling the jam jars – evaluation and celebration.

#### Course duration:

2.5 hours

#### Price:

£1,000 per 7-week course (14 participants).



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Sorry Not Sorry

This 7-week course is aimed at girls and young women over the age of 12. The most likely delivery point for this course would be in secondary schools, but also in youth groups, girls' groups and in female sporting activities. The course is self-esteem and activity-based with an opportunity to challenge stereotypes, societal views of women, safety and risk as well as being able to challenge and call out sexual harassment when experienced by self or others.



## **COURSES**

Our courses can be commissioned by one organisation for a number of staff, but we believe in the high value of multi-agency working. For this reason we will provide a calendar of training opportunities whereby organisations of any size can book one or more of their team members on to the courses to train alongside other professionals and volunteers in their geographical location.

Our courses for professionals and volunteers concentrate on the appropriate knowledge, skills and attitudes to deliver exceptional work in demanding times.

Our service user programmes are designed to support women, girls and young people to see what they already are and what they already have, and be curious and ambitious about what is ahead.
